

HOW TO GET BUSINESS STUDENTS EXCITED ABOUT WORKING IN PUBLIC PROCUREMENT

The new generation of graduates is increasingly concerned with meaningful work. Many business students are passionate about making a tangible difference in society through their future employment. In this advice note for business management educators, we explore four opportunities, including examples, resources, and guidance on how universities can get students excited about working in public procurement

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

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WICKED PROBLEM CASE STUDIES

Wicked case studies offer (regional) public contracting authorities the opportunity to present resolvable yet complex public procurement challenges they encounter. Students work in small groups to find a possible solution to their challenge – which they then present to the public contracting authority. This approach offers the opportunity for students to become familiar with public procurement without a considerable time investment (as compared to internships or research projects). It provides public contracting authorities with the opportunity to familiarise students with their organisation and work, and novel insights on solving the problem.

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

TIME INVESTMENT AND MATURITY LEVEL OF THE STUDENT

Previous examples of how to get business students excited about working in public procurement do not require significant time investment for students. If students want to explore public procurement further, a logical next step would be a public procurement internship or research project— ranging from seminar papers to a bachelor's or master's thesis within a public contracting authority. Below are three examples of possible research projects (which can also be combined with an internship).

ABOUT THE PROCEDIN PROJECT

PROcurement Capability – Embedding and Driving INnovation (PROCEDIN) is a Horizon Europe project funded by the European Commission. Its purpose is procurement of innovation (POI) capacity building among and between buyers (especially in public procurement) and firms (especially SMEs) and engaging other key stakeholders in building the POI ecosystem (especially educators).
